

General Description



Standard Product AOP607 is Pb-free (meets ROHS & Sony 259 specifications). AOP607L is a Green Product ordering option. AOP607 and AOP607L are electrically identical.



The value in any given application depends on the user's specific board design. The current rating is based on the $t \leq 10\text{s}$ thermal resistance rating.

B: Repetitive rating, pulse width limited by junction temperature.

C. The R_{0JA} is the sum of the thermal impedance from junction to lead R_{0JL} and lead to ambient.




Fig 1: On-Region Characteristics

D. The static characteristics in Figures 1 to 6 are obtained using 80 μs pulses, duty cycle 0.5% max.




Figure 2: Transfer Characteristics




Figure 3: On-Resistance vs. Drain Current and Gate Voltage




Figure 4: On-Resistance vs. Junction Temperature




Figure 5: On-Resistance vs. Gate-Source Voltage




Figure 6: Body-Diode Characteristics




Figure 7: Gate-Charge Characteristics




Figure 8: Capacitance Characteristics




Figure 9: Maximum Forward Biased Safe Operating Area (Note E)




Figure 10: Single Pulse Power Rating Junction-to-Ambient (Note E)




Figure 11: Normalized Maximum Transient Thermal Impedance

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
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


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


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


Figure 4: On-Resistance vs. Junction Temperature




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


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
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


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


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


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


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
